Electrical safety maintenance plan

The following is an example of an effective electrical safety maintenance plan for your rental property.

Mandatory requirements

 Have a safety switch installed on all power point circuits, or all final sub circuits if applicable.* 	Requirement
• Only use a licensed electrician for electrical work.	Requirement
Have a process in place for tenants to report electrical issues.	Requirement
• Have a process in place for the landlord or property manager to respond to reported electrical issues and that priority is given to immediate risks.	Requirement

Recommendations / best practice

Ensure safety switches are maintained and operational	
Ask tenants to conduct a push button test at least every three months.	Best practice
Organise operational testing by a licensed electrician at least every two years.	Recommended
Ensure electrical safety of the premises	
 Engage a licensed electrician to periodically: visually inspect hardwired electrical equipment (e.g. air-conditioners, electric hot water systems) 	Recommended
 inspect and test** other equipment provided as part of the tenancy agreement (e.g. washing machine, dishwasher). 	Recommended
 Organise the landlord or property manager, as part of regular inspections, to conduct a visual check for potential electrical safety issues (e.g. damaged light fittings, cracked or damaged power points or light switches). 	Recommended
 Organise the maintenance of solar PV systems by an accredited solar installer or licensed electrician as per manufacturers' requirements or at least annually. 	Recommended
Provide the tenant with information about electrical safety	
• Who to contact if there are electrical safety issues within the premises.	Recommended
• The importance of turning off all main switches at the switchboard before they, or any other person, enters the roof space.	Recommended
 Contact their electricity entity if anyone receives tingles or shocks from electrical equipment, a tap or other metal fittings. 	Recommended

*ALL new build homes MUST have a safety switch on all final sub-circuits and ALL homes that have electrical alterations may require a safety switch to be fitted on all affected circuits.

**If two yearly operational testing of safety switches in place then a visual inspection only
